CARDINAL PENSTEMON PENSTEMON CARDINALIS

THIS PENSTEMON, NATIVE TO NEW MEXICO AND TEXAS, IS ONE BIG, LUSCIOUS PLANT. UNUSUAL FOR A PENSTEMON, IT KEEPS MOST OF THE ROUNDED LEAVES NEARTHE BOTTOM OF THE PLANT, REACHING SKYWARD WITH THE SPARSELY FOLIAGED BLOOMING STEMS TO 3 1/2 IN HEIGHT. TOLERANT OF DROUGHT, IT IS WELL ADAPTED TO LIFE IN HOT, SUNNY ENVIRONMENTS, BUT ALSO BLOOMS WELL AND LOOKS (DARE WE SAY tt?) EVEN MORE STUNNING IN A PARTIALLY SHADED AREA WHERE IT REMINOS US OF A GIGANTIC HEUCHERA. IT IS NOT COMMONTO FIND SUCH DROUGHT-TOLERANCE COMBINED WITH SUCH A LUSH APPEARANCE, AND, AS SUCH, IT IS A GREATPLANT FOR FAUX ENGLISH GARDENS. THE BRIGHTRED BLOSSOMS ARRANGED ON TALL WANDS DRIVETHE HUMMINGBIRDS WILD WHEN IT BLOOMS FOR AN EXTENDED PERIOD IN MIDSUMMER TRULY, AN EXCEPTIONALLY BEAUTIFUL PLANT!
