AUTUMN STONECROP SEDUM FROSTY MORN



AN ICY COOL ADOMONTO THE ROCK GARDEN OR ANY AREA WITH DECENTORAINAGE, THIS UPRIGHT SEDUM HAS LIVELY, VARIEGATED LEAVES WHICH SEEM TO LIGHT UP THE ROOM. THE LATE SEASON FLOWERS ARE WHITE-TO ICE PINK, DEPENDING ON THE TEMPERATURE. LIKE OTHER UPRIGHT STONECROPS, THE FLATTOPPED BLOOMS OF THIS ONE ARE MUCH-LOVED BY BUTTERFLIES. A CLUMP FORMER, FROSTY MORN WILL REACH 12" HIGH AND WIDE. ONCE THE UPRIGHT STEMS DIE BACK FOR WINTER, CUTTHEM BACKTOTHE SMALL, CABBAGE-LIKE ROSETTES FORMING ATTHE BASE OF THE PLANT TO MAKE WAY FOR NEXT SEASON'S GROWTH. IF THE PLANT STARTS TO PRODUCE SOME STEMS THAT ARE ALL GREEN, SIMPLY REMOVE THE GREEN STEMS AS THEY APPEAR TO PRESERVE THE LOVELY VARIEGATION.
