CISTUS SALVIFOLIUS PROSTRATUS

ISN'T IT CURIOUS HOW SOME OF THE TOUGHEST PLANTS HAVE SOME OF THE MOST DELICATE LOOKING FLOWERS? THIS EVERGREEN, CARPETING SHRUB FILLS SOME OF THE MOST DIFFICULT SPACES. LOVING LIFE WHERE IT IS HOT AND DRY, IT WILL FORM A LOW (TO 1' TALL BY 5' ACROSS) MOUND OF CRINKLED, GRAY GREEN LEAVES THAT BURSTS INTO BLOOM IN MAY AND CAN BE PRACTICALLY SMOTHERED IN THE 1" WHITE BLOSSOMS BY JUNE. PERFECT FOR HOLDING SUNNY SLOPES, SAGELEAF ROCKROSE NEEDS LITTLE OTHER THAN DECENTLY DRAINING SOIL AND PLENTY OF SUNSHINE. ATTRACTS POLLINATORS
