CYLINDROPUNTIA IMBRICATA



WITH EACH PASSING OF SPRING INTO SUMMER, THE TREE CHOLLA CHANGES ITS PRICKLY PERSONALITY AND BURSTS INTO STUNNING, HOT PINK BLOOM. AS THE COMMON NAME IMPLIES, THIS IS NOT A TINY, DISH GARDEN SIZED CACTUS, BUT A LANDSCAPE PLANT OF SIZE AND IMPORT. EVENTUALLY REACHING UP TO 8' TALL, PUT IT IN A PLACE WHERE YOUR GUESTS WILL NOT HAVE TO BRUSH UP AGAINST IT GETTING TO YOUR DOOR, BUT INSTEAD CAN STAND BACK AND ADMIRE ITS SCULPTURAL BEAUTY, ITS LOVELY SPINES THAT LIGHT UP WHEN BACKLIT BY THE SUN, AND OF COURSE THE AMAZING, CREPE PAPER-LIKE, KNOCK-YOUR-SOCKS-OFF 2 1/2" BLOOMS. THIS COLD HARDY NATIVE OF THE SOUTHWEST LAUGHS AT DROUGHT AND IS ABOUT AS DEER AND RABBIT PROOF AS IT GETS.
