

HUMMINGBIRD SAGE

SALVIA SPATHACEA

THIS SHOWY CALIFORNIA NATIVE SAGE SPREADS BY RHIZOMES TO FORM A TALL GROUND COVER FOR DRY SHADED AREAS. THE MAGENTA BLOOMS SPROUT FROM DEEP, DARK CALYXES AND ARE ENOUGH TO MAKE THE HUMMINGBIRDS SWOON IN EARLY SPRING THROUGH SUMMER WHEN THE FLOWERING SPIKES REACH 3-4' IN HEIGHT. THE COARSE-TEXTURED EVERGREEN FOLIAGE IS HIGHLY AROMATIC AND THEREFORE ALSO HIGHLY RESISTANT TO DEER BROWSING. . DROUGHT-TOLERANT ENOUGH TO BE SUITABLE FOR PLANTING BENEATH OAKS, THIS SALVIA PROVIDES A SOLUTION FOR MANY DIFFICULT GARDENING AREAS WHILE MAKING A BOLD, NEARLY-TROPICAL STATEMENT. POLLINATOR HEAVEN.
